

Treasure Coast Disc Golf Board Meeting – Minutes Tuesday, Nov. 11, 2025 @ 8 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

Kraken Recap: Other than one player who was unhappy about his card assignment for the 2nd round, the event went well. There was a hiccup with the PDGA app making cards for MA4, but Erick had paper cards for everyone and we worked it out. A post-event survey was emailed out. (Attached to the minutes) The feedback was overall great. Surprisingly a few people said they would have rather played to the long baskets first, then shorts for the second round on the first day. There were a few negative comments about the shotgun start, but probably an equal amount that liked the shotgun. Erick said if he runs another shotgun at Gordy – he would cap the entries at 72. This would limit the cards to 4 tops, but if we wanted to add a few more we could or it would provide the flexibility to make 5 tops to keep divisions playing together. After the tournament, Erick deposited \$800 in the club account. \$105 was from Castro's flex starts; \$240 was from Hobart league and \$105 was from Gordy league and disc sales. Ryan said he has cash that he'll give Erick next time he sees him from Halpatiokee league. We didn't have a lot of players' packs/discs left over since we had about 8 volunteers that helped spot and check people in. And they were given player packs for their time. This was a huge help and for the next tournament, we should announce ahead of time that volunteers get players' packs. Maybe even order extras. We did have a lot of shirts left, especially in the smaller and women's sizes as we didn't have as many ladies and youth sign up.

Member Survey: Erick emailed the survey out to members in the November newsletter and will post it to the Facebook page. On the first day – we had 13 people fill it out. Not much was discussed until the results come in.

Flex Start Points Series: In the group chat, Castro asked about hosting more flex start, c-tier tournaments, but make them a points series.

Prices: Rated Round only \$16 / Rated Round & Disc \$26 / Rated Round & Point Series \$21 or \$26? All in \$31 or \$36?

Courses: Flex 1 Halpat / Flex 2 McCarty / Flex 3 Indian Hills. Hobart was suggested. Martin County can be challenging and would probably charge us \$300 to hold an event there.

Point System: 1st - 10 points / 2nd - 7 points / 3rd - 5 points / 4th - 3 points / 5th - 2 points / 6th

- 1 point

Timeframe: Early Jan - Flex Start 1 / Feb. 21 & 22 - Martin County Open / Late Feb or early March - Flex Start 2 / Late March or early April - Flex Start 3 / Late April - 10 Mile Creek

Everyone supports the idea.

New Year's Skills Challenge / Tag Drop: We still need to finalize the details, but instead of the singles event at McCarty – the idea is to do a random draw dubs at Lakewood Park followed by a skills challenge, like the World's event: Longest drive, putting challenge and accuracy challenge. It was mentioned that we should have forehand and backhand challenges on the longest drive; maybe even a roller contest. As far as tags go, the tags would be given in pairs, so the first place dubs would get No. 1 & 2, then second would get 3 & 4. The team can decide who gets the higher tag. There was a lengthily discussion about digital tags. Maybe players get a physical tag with a QR code and there is an app/site that tracks it. However, it doesn't seem like the technology/logistics would work. It's a challenge with players spread out of 3 counties and multiple leagues. UDisc might have a tag tracking option. Erick & Zac will do additional research on the UDisc tracking, but for now – we'll order traditional tags.

2026 PDGA Tournament Dates: The state sent out a new form to secure sanctioned event dates for next year. Erick will reach out to Martin County to secure the dates for our events at Halpatiokee, before we finalize things with the PDGA. For Gordy — we are good to keep our normal dates (late April for the 10-mile and the first weekend in November for the Kraken). We just need to secure TDs for these events. Erick ran two this past year, Jeff P ran one and August ran one.


TREASURER REPORT: No update/ Treasurer was out of town. But Erick said the post-Kraken invoices are all paid.


Kraken Post-Event Feedback – 37 responses

37 responses







Player's Packs:


