

Treasure Coast Disc Golf Board Meeting – Agenda Monday, Dec. 8, 2025 @ 8 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

2026 Membership Renewals: Erick suggested sending out the renewal letters and keeping the fees the same: \$20 to renew / \$25 for new members. If members don't renew by Feb. 1 – they should be charged as a new member. Everyone agreed. Erick also renewed the Club's PDGA affiliation, which gives our members a \$5 discount when renewing their PDGA membership.

Tags & Bags: At a previous meeting, everyone agreed that tags would be included in the membership and there was an online vote to get metal glow tags. The glow tags are \$6.75 each. Total cost for the tags with clips and shipping \$942.50. We also agreed that Hobart wouldn't have separate tags. We decided to order 130 total. This year's membership is about 115. This gives us room to grow and charge for lost / reissued tags. Mario mentioned Hobart had 3 new players and potential new club members on this past Sunday. Erick also suggested that we include some additional gift for membership renewals. He priced out some "sling bags" that we could get customized with the club logo. They would make great travel disc golf bags, holding up to 6 or 7 discs. Erick had several samples shipped to him. One was \$6.90 per bag for 130; the other was \$9.79 per bag. The group liked the "cheaper" bag since it had a better shoulder strap. Total cost for the bags: \$656. They could easily be ordered and arrive by New Year's Day. Erick ordered them in two different colors: blue/back and green/black.

New Year's Day Tag Drop / Big Disc Swingin' Challenge: This will be held at Lakewood Park. Erick suggested that for the tag drop – instead of having it a random draw doubles: We make it a singles round and each person that renews their members and shows up to play gets their new club bag with a driver, mid and putter from the unclaimed lost & found bins. Erick said there are about 70 drivers, 16 mids and 13 putters. Last year, we have about 38 members show up for the New Year's tag drop. We could encourage members to bring used putters and mids to donate to the bags and then they would get 3 to 5 mulligans for each disc they donate. The group felt 3 mulligans is enough. But people can donate additional discs if they want to make room for new discs. Everyone liked the idea. This helps get rid of the unclaimed disc (players can trade them or donate them back after the round). We might have enough for them to get 2 drivers. For the disc challenge – Erick suggested 3 different stations with a points/scoring system. He would draft some rules/scoring and share them for feedback. Mario asked if there would be a charge for the event. Erick suggested that your membership renewal should be the only cost and maybe the club could kick-in money for the challenge winners in each division (A & B pools and ladies). Maybe even the club could purchase lunch. The board wanted to wait for

input from the Treasurer and other to finalize those details.

Member Survey: Only 37 people took the survey. Erick will share it again. Results are included in the minutes. Overall people are happy with the club and events. There was talk about course improvements and where to focus our efforts, but no overwhelming direction from those who took the survey. There was also some discussion from the board about future courses in Indian River County, Torino Park and Tradition Regional Park, as well as new baskets at Rotary and/or Halpatiokee. Erick felt that we might be able to get PSL to pay for the baskets at Rotary. He wasn't so hopeful about Martin County. Erick will reach out to PSL's Parks Director.

Flex Start Points Series: No updates

2026 PDGA Tournament Dates: Erick submitted all the dates the PDGA state coordinator: Martin County Open Feb. 21-22; Up the 10-Mile Creek April 25-26; Blackwater Open June 6-7 and the Kraken Nov. 7-8.

Erick has already submitted the paperwork, insurance and paid for the rental for the Martin County Open. Martin County has increased the rental fee from \$285 to \$506. Ryan and Zac said they'd serve as the TDs for the MC Open. Ryan said the average price for B-tier events is \$65 to \$100. He suggested \$80. Mario & Jeff felt that was a big jump. Erick suggested \$70 or \$75 – this will help cover the increase fees. Ryan suggested updating the sponsorship letter. Erick sent what we currently have on the website to the group for review / input. Following the meeting, Erick reached out to Play Treasure Coast (formerly Treasure Coast Sports Commission) about the club getting sponsorship or grants. The staff was very helpful and said they usually for \$10 per player that travels more than 50 miles for an event. And he said they struggle to spend grant funds in Martin County as that county has less sporting venues than St. Lucie and Indian River. Erick went back and looked at the players from the last Martin County Open and found that 61 players traveled more than 50 miles.







Survey Results - 12/10/25








Is there a specific event / tournament that you'd like to run or see the Club host?






When it comes to course improvements, please rate which are most relevant to you.




